Brothers and sisters: In times past, God spoke in partial and various ways to our ancestors through the prophets; in these last days, he has spoken to us through the Son, whom he made heir of all things and through whom he created the universe.

who is the refulgence of his glory, the very imprint of his being,

and who sustains all things by his might word.

When he had accomplished purification from sins, he took his seat at the right hand of the Majesty on high,

as far superior to the angels

The only Son, God, who is at the Father's side, has revealed him.]
