Bonds of Love

We continue to celebrate this festive season of Christmas by honoring the Holy Family. Jesus' mother, Mary, and his foster father, Joseph, each trusted in the Lord when they accepted the unique start to their family. Though their family faced dangers

from the start, they remained united in love, which Saint Paul calls the bond of perfection.

Today's readings relate values all families should treasure. Sirach 3 speaks of the way we ought to treat each other, closing with a moving portrayal of an adult child and elderly parent.

Infants can do very little for themselves; parents must patiently do everything the infant requires. At the opposite end of the spectrum, seniors are often equally reliant on their children. Sirach instructs children to care for their elderly parents, recognizing that not only their strength but their mind may fail. For both child and parent this may be quite difficult. It is especially then that we must "put on... heartfelt compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience, bearing with one another and forgiving one another," for the supple bond of love can easily strain or snap.

Paul lists the qualities we should manifest in our families, especially love. Luke tells the story of Mary and Joseph bringing the infant Jesus to the temple in order to present him to God. Let us try to see our own families in their words. And, may our families share these bonds of love, enabling us to face the hardships and sorrows of life.




Sunday, December 27 Readings

Reading I: Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14—Those who fear the Lord honor their parents. **Responsorial Psalm:** Psalm 128—Blessed are those who fear the Lord

and walk in his ways.

Reading II: Colossians 3:12-21 or

3:12-17—Clothe yourself with heartfelt mercy. **Gospel:** *Luke* 2:22-40 or 2:22, 39-40—The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom.



Feast of the Holy Family

There are many types of families— Traditional, Blended, Single-parent, Same-sex, Foster, Adoptive, Couples who just live together, People who live by themselves.

All of them have challenges to face—family tensions, pressure, divergent values and beliefs,

addiction, mental health issues, illness, job insecurity, financial problems, loneliness...

We look at the family of Joseph, Mary, and Jesus this morning. They had challenges to face too. However, they faced and responded to their challenges as a holy family. They grew in age, strength, wisdom and grace before other people and God.

When people look at our families, they may not see a perfect family, but they can see a family that is striving toward holiness, trying to learn the ways of The Holy Family.

Live in God's presence. Walk in his ways.

- Respect the people around you—unborn, infants, siblings, parents, spouses, grandparents, the sick, the dying, neighbors, friends, coworkers, people who do not share your viewpoints, enemies. Respect for them is respect for God.
- Respect appropriate boundaries—fidelity, appropriate sexual activity, non-violence. Avoid abuse in all its forms—emotional, verbal, physical, sexual, financial especially toward children, dependent adults, and the elderly.
- Put on Christ's Love—compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, patience, bearing with one another, forgiving one another, loving one another
- Do it for a lifetime.

My children, take care of your parents when they are old; grieve them not as long as they live. Even if their minds fail, be considerate of them; revile them not all the days of their lives; kindness to a parent will not be forgotten. (Sirach)

No family is a perfect family, but every family can strive to become a holy family. We, too, can grow in age, strength, wisdom and grace before other people and God.
