Third Sunday in Ordinary Time



The Call

Jesus chose as his home base the city of Capernaum, a fishing village on the shore of the Sea of Galilee. Jesus encounters the brothers Simon and

Andrew, casting a net into the sea. Because Capernaum was a bustling fishing village, the brothers were probably among a large number of fishermen. From that crowd, Jesus sees and calls the two he wants to be his disciples. Not saying whether Jesus had met Simon and Andrew previously, nor whether they had heard his preaching, Matthew draws our attention to the power of Jesus' word and the ideal immediacy of response. Simon and Andrew will continue to be fishermen, Jesus tells them, only their catch from now on will be people. Jesus' words to them are both an invitation and a promise of a new life's work. The next two brothers, James and John, similarly leave everything, even their father Zebedee, again showing the ideal response to Jesus. The four fishermen are leaving all security to follow the uncertain travels of an itinerant rabbi.

The brief summary of Jesus' ministry in the concluding verse tells how he brought light to those dwelling in darkness. His teaching and ministry transformed the darkness of ignorance, the darkness of despair, and the darkness of broken bodies.

Walk with us!

Upcoming Journeys: 3 Stages in 3 Days (39 miles)—February 3-5. Join us for a guided and meaningful journey through the eastern side of Sonoma County. Our “Spanish Side” journey will traverse the first 3 stages of the Camino, beginning at the Mission San Francisco Solano and ending in Sebastopol, aka “Peace Town.” These stages cover a variety of terrain and elevations, averaging 13 miles each day.

Days begin at 8:00 a.m. and finish around 4:00 p.m. Participants will be provided additional information prior to the Camino. Guided walks are now coordinated via our online community on Facebook. Find our group at Walking Camino de Sonoma and RSVP for each day’s scheduled stage. Pilgrims are welcomed to make arrangements to walk shorter distances for Stages 1 & 3.

To continue through gorgeous Sonoma County, walking the remaining 41 miles of the last three stages (Stages 4, 5, and 6), finishing on the bluffs at Fort Ross State Historic State Park overlooking the majestic Pacific Ocean, you are invited to reserve a spot to walk individual stages, or join us for the entire pilgrimage.
