Fairness & Generosity

"It's not fair!" We sympathize with the laborers who worked all day only to find out that they made not a penny more than those who worked for only an hour. This is an obvious injustice. What's the point of having a "daily wage" and an "hourly wage" if the numbers are the same? In the first reading we hear the Lord tell

Isaiah, "my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways." Yes, from our perspective the landowner's arrangement is unfair and the consequences for the hardest workers is an injustice. But our perspective is flawed. God, source of infinite love, infinite mercy, and infinite generosity, sees this arrangement much differently. May we be humbled by Isaiah's reminder.

"Because no one has hired us." This is the response of the laborers who were still standing around at five o'clock. Why hasn't anyone hired these workers? Perhaps they were injured, weak, or disabled. Perhaps they were lazy or uncooperative. Quite likely they were already rejected by every other landowner. But not this one. The kingdom of heaven welcomes even those who have been rejected, who have been waiting, who did not bear the heavy burden. God's mercy and acceptance are unrestricted.

You may have a sexual abuse claim or other claim against the Diocese of Santa Rosa.


On March 13, 2023, The Roman Catholic Bishop of Santa Rosa aka Diocese of Santa Rosa ("Debtor") filed for protection under Chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code.

If you were sexually abused by any person connected with the Debtor, you must file a claim so as to be received by October 20, 2023, or otherwise you will be forever barred, estopped, and enjoined from asserting such claim against the Debtor.

Claims based on acts or omissions of the Debtor that occurred before March 13, 2023, must be filed on or before October 20, 2023, even if such claims are not now fixed, liquidated, or certain or did not mature or become fixed, liquidated, or certain before March 13, 2023.
