Autumn Leaves

In the autumn, as leaves are dying all around us and nights are growing longer, it is natural for our thoughts to turn to the end of our lives. We may ask ourselves if we will be ready when the Lord comes to meet us. Perhaps we have experienced the sudden, unexpected death of a loved one. Perhaps we have kept vigil with someone who died slowly. If so, we know that death is an unpredictable and everpresent reality in every human life.

How are we to live our lives in the face of such knowledge? What is wise? Today's scriptures address these questions. We are not to live as though we are immortal and nothing can harm us. Neither are we to live in fear and despair. Paul tells the Thessalonians to console one another with the knowledge that we are meant to be reunited with our loved ones for eternity. Jesus tells his disciples not to be so foolish as to think that they can get by with only the bare minimum of faith, hope, and love.

Stay Awake!

How then, shall we live our lives?

We are told to keep vigil and to "stay awake." What does that mean? It means that we keep our spirits well stocked with faith, hope, and love, so that our "lamps" will not burn out too soon. It means that we continually seek out wisdom, especially in dark times of suffering. It means that we are always ready for the Lord to come in unexpected ways, teach us unexpected lessons, and bring unexpected joys, even in unexpected situations. Then, at the moment of death we will be prepared, because we will be in the habit of watching for and welcoming the Lord.

Vocation Awareness Priest Appreciation Day– November 12


The Family Support Network is embarking on a campaign to celebrate our priests. We are encouraging parishes and

St. Julius the Veteran

Born in 255 to pagan parents, Julius converted to Christianity sometime before he was conscripted into the Roman army. He served in seven military campaigns over 27 years, and his faith was overlooked because he was an excellent soldier and he served during a time when Christianity was tolerated by the Romans. That changed during the Diocletian persecution, however, and when Julius refused to give a public sacrifice to the Roman gods he was brought before Maximus the prefect. Maximus complemented Julius on his excellent military record and offered freedom and 10 years of wages as a bonus if he would offer the public sacrifice. Julius refused and was put to death by a sword.



Many brave men and women have served their country and are now in veteran hospitals that work to mend veterans' bodies, but little is done to mend and attend to their souls.
