### March 16/17, 2024 — Fifth Sunday of Lent

#### **Jesus' Ministry Summarized**

n the story of the raising of Lazarus from the dead, we find a summary of most of Jesus' ministry. We see his human nature as he is moved by Martha and Mary's sorrows and as he himself weeps at the tomb of Lazarus. He explains to his followers that the death of Lazarus will serve as a sign of the glory of God. He crowns the miracles he works in John's Gospel by raising Lazarus from the dead-a "preview," if you will, of his own death and resurrection to come. This portrait of Jesus reminds us that he is with us, knows us, understands us in every moment of our lives. He knows the joy of our human feasting; he knows the sorrow of our weeping. As we prepare to walk with him through the days of Holy Week, we are filled with faith that through Christ—God's glory will be with us in every moment of our lives and-with Christ-in our life everlasting.

#### **Living in the Light & Life**

We have been following, in John's Gospel, the road to Jesus' destiny—to the place where the Father would be given the ultimate glory in his passion, death, and resurrection. Sometimes we need Jesus to walk that same sort of road with us. We may think that a life situation, illness, or ailment is somehow a retribution for some wrong that we have done, and we must seek Jesus Christ to take us past that moment into a place of healing. When death itself enters or touches our lives somehow, we are called upon to place our ultimate trust and faith in Jesus Christ alone. He can take our chiding for not making our lives tribulation-free; but beyond that he can weep with us. He can be with us in the most woeful times of darkness and death, and transform them into God's glorious day of resurrected new life. When we are filled with faith in the Resurrection and Life, then we also will live and reign with him in everlasting glory.

#### **Pray The Mercy Mantra**

Gregory Palamas, a saint of the Eastern Orthodox, Melkite, and Ukrainian Catholic Churches, taught that the use of the Jesus Prayer: "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner" prepares one to receive the grace-filled light of the Lord. This short, formulaic prayer has its roots in the parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector (Luke 18:9-14.) Saint John Paul II repeatedly cited Palamas as one of the great spiritual writers of history. Today, join with John Paul II and Palamas in heaven and the multitude of Catholics throughout the world who recite this spiritual mantra over and over again seeking the Lord's mercy.

During Lent you are encouraged to do personal Stations of the Cross by using the handout on the Divine Mercy counter near the vigil lights in the back of the church.

### Response to A Lenten Reflection

Our Lenten Reflection was a resounding success. At least seventy-five parishioners attended the event, which featured Sister Joann Heinritz, a Sister of St. Joseph of Carondelet, and Marcy Fox, one of our own parishioners. Both Sister Joann and Marcy were inspiring and engaging, offering an interactive session about how we can deepen our spirituality during the season of Lent. Sister Joann talked about two distinct visions of Lent, one emphasizing deprivation and a second vision that emphasized the idea of being a "blessing." Sister Joann encouraged us to view ourselves as a blessing and to look at how we can be a blessing to others during the Lenten season.

Marcy told us many stories, including her own story of fighting cancer, while emphasizing how we must keep our eyes open, our ears attentive, our spirit alert and our shirt sleeves rolled up. This was an effective mantra showing us how we need to reach out beyond ourselves to help others and truly live the Lenten spirit. Both Sister Joann and Marcy left us with so much to think about and follow through with during the next weeks of Lent and throughout the whole Easter season.

A tremendous thank you to Marcy, Sister Joann, and the spiritual committee of the Women's Circle for developing the Lenten reflection, and to all the helpers who set up the refreshments in the Quiet Room, brought cookies and assisted in the event.


