The Good Shepherd

This Fourth Sunday of Easter is traditionally referred to as "Good Shepherd Sunday." Today we listen to the words of the Lord as he refers to himself as the "good shepherd who lays down his life for the sheep." It is sometimes so difficult for us to grasp the

reality that anyone would lay down his or her own life for the sake of someone else. This is especially true in a society that places high value on power and personal advancement, often at the cost of "trampling" on other people in order to climb the ladder. Today's scriptures point to the one we are called to emulate—the one who lays down his life for his sheep. They challenge us to discover ways to bring life to those around us—to build up rather than to tear down.

Saint Peter: Example for All

What an extraordinary example we have in the person of Saint Peter. On this Good Shepherd Sunday, it is fitting that the first reading draws our attention to the "rock." The scene depicted in the reading from the Acts of the Apostles contains an example that can be useful to all of us, whether ordained or lay. Notice that after the miracle of the curing of the crippled person, Peter immediately turns everyone's attention not to himself, but to the Lord Jesus Christ. This is what we are called to do when we experience the presence of God in the struggles of our own Christian journeys. Like Saint Peter, we can let other people know that it is only through the power of Christ within each of us that we are able to embrace the cross and experience the power of the Lord's resurrection.

stone rejected by the builders has become the cornerstone.


Reading II: 1 John 3:1-2—We are God's children now. **Gospel:** John 10:11-18—The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep.

Rooted in Baptism

Today gives us the opportunity to take the time to pray for those who lead us in ordained ministry. In this time of crisis in our diocese and in the Church, our bishops, deacons, and priests need our support as they continue to embrace their vocation to do as Saint Peter did-to point others to the Lord. Since all vocations are rooted in the sacrament of baptism, it is good for us to remember that it was at the moment of our baptism that we became Christ for others. Each of us is called to become more and more like the Good Shepherd as we learn to live out our baptismal call. As we make our way along the Christian journey, we need nourishment and guidance from those appointed to be our shepherds. We need to pray that God will strengthen those who have become weary. On this Good Shepherd Sunday, let us pray especially for the ordained and all those called to point us to the Lord.

Thank you to the Women's Circle for sponsoring the Valley of the Moon Children's Center and Foundation presentation last Tuesday afternoon. The presentation was excellent and well-received by at least 50 attendees.

Cheyenne McConnell Not only did we learn about the new programs put in place for abused and neglected children, and how their foundation has successfully developed education and health programs for the children, but we heard from one of the many graduates who has been helped by these programs.

Cheyenne McConnell, a young college graduate, was so inspiring as she related "her story." At just 6 years old she had already lived through tremendous trauma when she entered the Children's Center and the foster care system. Finding her strength in the love of learning, she excelled in school. It was through the help of the Valley of the Moon Children's Center and the Foundation, which gave Cheyenne the needed resources and support, that she recently graduated from Sonoma State University with a degree in psychology. She is now working on a master's degree. Cheyenne was a tangible symbol of the strength, value, and importance of the programs of both the Valley of the Moon Children's Center and its' robust Foundation.

We were also introduced to Our Village Closet, another component of the system put in place for neglected and abused children. The Village Closet is a place where foster care parents and children can meet, shop for clothes and other basic needs, find support and learn about other resources to help them.

A huge thank you to Pat Hendricks and the Women's Circle for bringing us this inspirational program, including, members who set-up, brought cookies, arranged for the tea and coffee and cleaned up. Also, thank you to all who attended and gave donations to the Women's Circle to help cover the cost of refreshments, and support future events at Star of the Valley.

Lake County Annual Outdoor Passion Play Third Weekend in May


