Christ's Enduring Presence for All Times

I have always imagined that the Lord's followers were very deflated, to the point of depression, when he ascended into the heavens before their eyes. This was the man who had completely changed their lives. This was the man whom they had abandoned, yet who brought them the Easter peace of reconciliation and forgiveness. It could have all ended in that place where Jesus ascended. We all know it did not. The Lord Jesus left his followers gifts that would always and forever make his presence known to them. And these gifts are at our disposal to this day. Every time we gather to celebrate the sacraments, especially the Eucharist, we know the presence of the Lord. Christ's presence inspires us to take his final words to his followers very seriously. It is in Christ and through the power of the Holy Spirit that we continue to make the gospel message known to those we meet. Today is not a day to celebrate the departure of Christ from this world. It is a day to celebrate the enduring presence of the Lord.

Proclaim the Gospel

Today we celebrate one of the tenets of our creed: that the Lord ascended into heaven. From Mark's Gospel we hear the final words Jesus spoke to his disciples shortly before he ascended into heaven. Those were words of commissioning, no less real for us today than they were to the disciples then. We are called to "proclaim the gospel to every creature." For the vast majority of us, this means that we proclaim the gospel by the witness of our everyday lives. Treating others with dignity and respect, providing for those less fortunate than ourselves, (*Proclaim the Gospel continued inside.*)

Reading I: Acts 1:1-11—As the Apostles were looking on, Jesus was lifted up.

Responsorial: Psalm 47—God mounts his throne to shouts of joy:

a blare of trumpets for the Lord.

Reading II: *Ephesians 4:1-13*—To the extent of the full stature of Christ.

Gospel: *Mark* 16:15-20—The Lord Jesus was taken up into heaven and took his seat at the right hand of God.

(**Proclaim the Gospel** continued.) being good stewards of the many gifts showered on us, coming together as God's family in worship and praise—these are all signs that the gospel has taken root in our lives.



good works for the poor. Young Imelda quickly developed a love for prayer, and she frequently went to Mass and attended nighttime prayer. At the age of 9 she asked to leave home to go live with the Dominican nuns at a monastery, and her parents reluctantly agreed. She participated with the nuns in every part of their life but one: she was too young to receive the Eucharist, which she longed to receive. On the Vigil of the Ascension, she was seen at Mass bathed in light with the Eucharist suspended above her head. The priest gave her her first Holy Communion, and after a long ecstasy, she was found to have died in prayer, smiling.

Today, pray for the Holy Spirit to enflame the love for the real presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist in your heart, and in the hearts of others around the world.
