November 2/3, 2024 Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time

Statutes & Commandments

In the Book of Deuteronomy, we are given civil laws and religious laws. We hear about laws that help us to love God and show us how to live as God's people. The word "fear" in this context does not mean being afraid, but is used in the sense of obedient children deferring to a loving parent. Jesus came to help lead us to God. Like a priest, he mediates between God and the human race. In Mark's Gospel today, it is in this character that Jesus clarifies God's laws of living. A scribe asked him what was the greatest law. Jesus responded with the words of Deuteronomy, teaching that it was most important to love God. But he quickly added the second most important law: to love our neighbors as much as we love ourselves. Jesus told the scribe that if he understood and lived the words he had just heard, he was close to the Kingdom of God.

Love Your Neighbor

Jesus wasn't very specific about who our neighbors were, but he probably did not confine his definition to just the person next door. In order to show our love for God, we must first show that love in the way we take care of our neighbors, especially those in vulnerable situations.

It is good that we call ourselves Christians because we diligently obey God's commandments, attend church regularly, and live moral lives. But deep down in our hearts, we know we need to do more. If we look at how Jesus loved his neighbors, how he took time to listen to them, care for them, and heal them in their brokenness, then we see how we are to love one another. Our actions today need to be modeled on those of Jesus.

Reading I: Deuteronomy 6:2-6—Hear, O Israel! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart.



Peter Hardy's Harvest Dinner Pumpkin Pie Cake

Prep Time: 20 minutes. Cook Time: 50 minutes.

Servings: 18, Yield: 1 (9x13-inch) cake

- 1 (15.25 ounce) package yellow cake mix
- ½ cup butter or margarine
- 1 large egg
- 1 (29-ounce) can pumpkin puree
- ²/₃ cup evaporated milk
- 3 large eggs
- ½ cup white sugar
- 1½ teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 1/4 cup butter or margarine
- 1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).
- 2. Grease and flour a 9x13-inch baking pan.
- 3. Reserve 1 cup cake mix from the package. Set aside.
- 4. In a bowl, combine remaining cake mix, melted butter, and 1 egg. Press mixture into the bottom and sides of prepared pan to form a crust.
- 5. Mix together pumpkin, evaporated milk, 3 eggs, sugar, and cinnamon until blended. Pour over crust.
- 6. Combine brown sugar and reserved 1 cup cake mix in a bowl, then cut in butter until mixture is crumbly. Sprinkle over pumpkin filling.
- 7. Bake in preheated oven for 50 minutes. Cool before serving. Keep refrigerated.
