# June 21/22, 2025 — Corpus Christi — The Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ

#### **A Simple Act**

A man named Jack was preparing to receive the sacraments of initiation. Part of the process was to have the catechumens (those preparing for the sacraments) join other parishioners in various ministries and activities in the parish and in the wider community. Jack was a gregarious, comical, wonderful man who always gave the group a spark of enthusiasm. He was never at a loss for words. One week the group of catechumens went to the local homeless shelter to prepare and serve the evening meal. When we returned from this outing, Jack did not speak for about six weeks. We became concerned, but decided, at the urging of his sponsor, to allow him to take the time he needed to break out of this silence.

#### **A Life Changed Forever**

Finally, Jack shared what was going on in his life. He told us that at the homeless shelter, he was front and center. He had positioned himself so that he could ladle the sloppy joe mix onto the hamburger buns and hand the plate to the person in line. He said he was just loving the work, grasping the ladle, spooning the mixture onto the bun, then handing the plate to the next person, when all of a sudden, a deep reality struck him. He said, "This is what my hands were meant to do." Then he shared with us that many of the things his hands had done in his life were sinful and didn't bring life to anyone. He told us again and again that what he was doing at the shelter was what his hands were created to do. Jack's story is a great reminder to each of us on this feast. As people who regularly consume the Body and Blood of Christ, we are called to do what we were created to do: become Christ for one another.

#### **SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST (CORPUS CHRISTI)** We Are One

Unity is what our sacrament of Communion is about: oneness with God and each other. Yet, because we're human, that communion is necessarily paired up with another sacrament that does the work of reconciling. When unity gets torn, reconciliation repairs the damage. Lately, toxic polarization has been shredding our national unity, creating an illusion of insurmountable division. Media sources sharpen the knives of contrasting worldviews, leading to anxiety and depression, fear and violence. Trust in unity. Resist being recruited in the polarization game.

#### **Celebrating Corpus Christi**

The Solemnity of Corpus Christi (Dies Sanctissimi Corporis et Sanguinis Domini Jesu Christi) is a liturgical feast of the Real Presence of the Most Holy Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist.

Pope Urban VI having been deeply moved by the Eucharistic Miracle of Bolsena, on the input of one of the greatest theologians of the time, St. Thomas Aguinas. established this feast in 1264. The pontiff commissioned Aquinas to compose the liturgical texts for the feast, including hymns that are still sung today, such as "Pange Lingua" and "Tantum Ergo."

#### **Blessed Eva of Liège**

Born in 1205 to a wealthy family of nobles in Belgium, not much is known about the early life of Eva of Liège. At some point in her teens or early twenties, she became an anchoress, living in a cell attached to the Basilica of St. Martin, and she spent her life in prayer and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Another nun, Juliana, had a similar devotion to the Blessed Sacrament and befriended Eva. Juliana confided in Eva about a vision she had as a teen during Eucharistic adoration, and also of her desire to institute a feast of Eucharistic veneration. The cause for the feast was elevated to their bishop. St. Juliana died, but Eva continued promoting the cause until it was instituted as the Solemnity of Corpus Christi.

When faced with the trials of her office of superioress, it was in Blessed Eva's cell where St. Juliana found refuge. Blessed Eva continued the cause for Corpus Christi, and—at the pope's request—it was to her that St. Thomas Aquinas sent a copy of the office of readings he composed for the feast. 
