# June 28/29, 2025—Solemnity of Sts. Peter & Paul, Apostles

#### **The Name Game**

Today's solemnity might have been "Saints Simon and Saul" if it hadn't been for some renaming. There are numerous examples from the Bible of people being given new names to indicate their new status in God's plan of salvation. This practice begins with Abraham, and we see the fruit of that in today's renaming of Simon as Peter when he makes his great profession of faith in Jesus as Messiah (Christ) and Son of God. Saul, through Acts recounts a significant conversion experience for him, is renamed rather silently by the New Testament. Even though the author of the Acts of the Apostles occasionally slips and still calls him "Saul" after his conversion experience, his new name-most likely intended by the New Testament to differentiate his Christian mission from his life as a Jew–occurs most frequently in Acts, and exclusively in his own letters, as "Paul." The naming of Peter is reminiscent of our own naming at baptism, when our own faith in Jesus as Christ was proclaimed. Even though most of us never go through a changing of our proper name later in life (though this was characteristic of religious profession for many years), a bit of reflection will help us to discern the ways in which God has called us anew or named us again for our own role in proclaiming the Good News.

## Both/And, Not Either/Or

It's not surprising that, as we read through the New Testament, Peter tended to be a stronger advocate of adhering to the ways of religious praxis inherited from the Jewish tradition. Paul, meanwhile, led the church to a life of more freedom within religious law, focused more on faith and the Spirit. *(Continued on back page.)*

#### Feast of Sts. Peter & Paul

Saul of Tarsus was born about three years after Jesus in modern-day Turkey into a family that descended from the tribe of Benjamin. Because his father was a Roman citizen, Saul also had the Latin name Paul. When young Saul wasn't being taught the Jewish faith, he learned the trade of tentmaking. Fiery in his faith, after the Crucifixion of Christ he was known for his intense persecution of Christians, including the stoning death of St. Stephen. After his "come to Jesus" moment on the road to Damascus, he became known for his passionate epistles, fearless defense of orthodox Christianity, missionary travels, and evangelistic zeal. During the Christian persecutions by Emperor Nero, he was arrested, tried, and beheaded.

Born in Bethsaida about a year after Jesus, Simon was the brother of St. Andrew and he grew up to be a professional fisherman whose boldness in speech and action is captured throughout the Gospels. When Jesus called Simon and Andrew, they dropped their nets and followed him. It is clear that Simon was regarded as the leader of the disciples, as he is always listed first in the Gospels. Though Simon denied him three times, Jesus changed his name to Peter when instituting the Church and gave Peter "the keys." From then on, St. Peter led the Church in its infancy, preached, performed miracles, wrote epistles, and named bishops. When martyred in Rome, he requested that his crucifix would be upside down because he was not worthy to die as Christ did.


#### **Ushers Needed** to Help with Collections

Wisely, the celebrations of these two saints, bedrock of the earthly church, are combined, for the Church has always lived and witnessed best when we have respected and honored our heritage, customs, and traditions of faith, yet remained open to change and ongoing revelation from on high. The Body of Christ, in this way, is the same as any other body: it remains the same body in many ways, but also must seek ongoing nourishment, encounter illness, and inevitably be altered through growth. The Holy Spirit has provided admirable examples for us in the persons of Peter and Paul. As they-grounded in their faith, named and called for Jesus Christ's mission-sought to spread the gospel in every place at every hour, let us likewise joyfully join that same mission.

# Feast of Sts. Peter & Paul

Today is the feast of both St. Paul and St. Peter, who were martyred about the same time. St. Augustine of Hippo said, "...though they suffered on different days, they were as one.... Let us embrace what they believed, their life, their labors, their sufferings, their preaching, and their confession of faith." Read the second epistle of St. Paul to Timothy, which many consider his last letter.

St. Peter is the first Pope of the Catholic Church,

though many Protestants deny his authority as well as the concept of apostolic succession that ensures that the Church will have one leader—the Vicar of Christ until Christ returns. Understanding what Jesus meant and what his Jewish audience would understand by "the keys" is important to be able to defend this teaching. Read Isaiah 22:19-25, which the Jews would have known. Then compare it to Matthew 16:11-19.
